I. What is worship.

<u>English</u> word comes from the Anglo-Saxon word - "worth". It means one worthy of reverence and honor. (Rev. 5:12-14)

The meaning of the worship is connected to His Glory. God is glorified when He is seen and understood. When we see God for who He is, we reverence and honor Him.

<u>Hebrew</u> word means to bow down or to prostrate oneself. I has to do with attitude of both mind and body. It is adoration and submission.

Greek 1. "Kiss the hand toward one". Token of reverence. - John 4:20-24
